PALM SUNDAY

April 01, 2023, Sat. 5PM CHRIST THE SERVANT CHURCH, April 02, 2023 Sun. 8AM ST. MARY'S CHURCH, 9:30AM CTS, 11AM STM

This great solemnity celebrates Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem for the Jewish festival of Passover. Great crowds of people lined the streets waving branches to welcome Jesus, shouting "Hosanna"Palm branches are blessed and distributed. This day is also known as "Passion Sunday because the church anticipates "Good Friday by reading the Passion according to St. Luke.

HOLY MONDAY

April 03, 2023 CHRISM MASS 5:00PM, Dinner at 7:00PM – CATHEDRAL IN NELSON. The oils that we use for Sacraments are blessed at this mass.



HOLY THURSDAY

April 06, 2023, 7:00PM - CHRIST THE SERVANT CHURCH

Holy Thursday is the day on which we commemorate the Last Supper of Jesus (Our Eucharist). He washed the feet of his disciples as an act of humility and service. The mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated this evening. After mass, the Blessed Sacrament is taken in procession to an "Altar of Repose" and the main altar is stripped bare. Even the Holy water is removed from the fonts until the Easter Vigil when we renew our Baptismal promises. Since Holy Thursday is the day which commemorates the first Holy Eucharist, adoration of the Real Presence of our Lord by all the faithful at the "Altar of Repose" is strongly encouraged until 10:00PM.

Inside the Liturgy is the installation of the new Extraordinary Lay Ministers of the Eucharist and Ministers of The Word (Lectors) and the renewal commitments of the same Ministers of the Word and the Eucharist.

GOOD FRIDAY

April 07, 2023, 3:00PM - CHRIST THE SERVANT CHURCH

Good Friday is the day of the Crucifixion. It is a day on which Christians fast and pray, calling to mind the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. In this way, we participate in his suffering in order that we may also participate in his resurrection. The Liturgy is composed of 3 parts. The Liturgy of the Word, Veneration of the Cross, and giving donations for Holy Land support, and followed by Holy Communion.

HOLY SATURDAY

April 08, 2023, 8:00PM - ST. MARY'S CHURCH

Holy Saturday, during the day, our churches are bare and desolate. No mass may be offered during the day. The blessing of Easter Food will be at CHRIST THE SERVANT CHURCH at 12:00noon.

While this is more customary among Poles, Italians, and Ukrainians, everyone is welcome to attend the blessing rites.

THE EASTER VIGIL: After a day of desolation, the faithful, keeping vigil during Holy Saturday night, participate with Christ in the joy of his resurrection, anticipating Christ's final coming. The vigil has 4 main parts.

THE CELEBRATION OF THE NEW LIGHT: Reminds us that Christ is our light. Fire is blessed, and from this new fire, the Paschal Candle is lit, and subsequently all candles in the dark church. The silence of the night is broken by the sound of the "EXULTET".

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD: Recalls the main events of our salvation from creation to Christ Resurrection.

THE LITURGY OF BAPTISM: Reminds us that we were baptized into Christ and so participate in his saving works. First water, the sign of cleansing and new life, is blessed; then we renounce our sins and renew our profession of faith.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST: We offer a perfect sacrifice and receive our Savior in Holy Communion. The mass ends with solemn blessings as the people of God go forth to proclaim and live the Good News of the Resurrection.

Positive Prayer Makes Strong Relationships by Rick Warren

"And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ — to the glory and praise of God." (Philippians 1:9-11 NIV)

I want you to think of somebody who irritates you — maybe somebody you've got a strained relationship with or who just rubs you the wrong way. I have two questions for you: One, do you pray for that person? Or do you just complain and grumble and nag and nitpick? If you prayed more, you'd have a lot less to grumble, complain, nag, and nitpick about. It's your decision.

Does nagging work? No. Does prayer work? Yes. So why do you do more of the thing that doesn't work than does?

Paul says in Philippians 1:4, "Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy" (NLT).

Paul didn't just pray for people in his life; he prayed with joy!

There are things in other people's lives that you'd like to change. You don't want to change yourself; you want *them* to change. We always want to change other people. But you can't!

You can, however, pray, and let God do his work in other people.

Positive praying is more effective than positive thinking. All the positive thinking in the world isn't going to change your husband or your wife or your child or your friend or your situation. Positive thinking can change you, but it won't change somebody else. But positive prayer can make a difference in someone else.

Do you want to know the quickest way to change a bad relationship to a good one? Start praying for the other person! It will change you, and it can change the other person.

Paul even told us how to pray for others: "And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ — to the glory and praise of God" (Philippians 1:9-11 NIV).

We **pray** for the people in our lives.

that they will grow in love: "And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight."

that they will make wise choices: "... so that you may be able to discern what is best ..."

that they will live with integrity: "... and may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ ..."

that they will become like Jesus: "... filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ — to the glory and praise of God."


